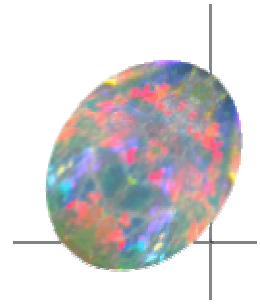


Australian Opals

- It is estimated that Australia's opal fields were formed more 30 million years ago.

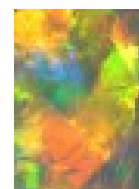
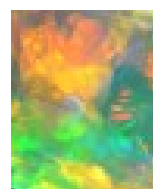
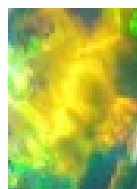
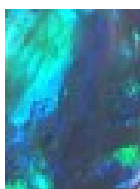
