



Warrawong Earth Sanctuary

Come to "Paradise on Earth"!

A rare opportunity to relax in natural bushlands and enjoy Australian flora and fauna in a unique setting!

Waarawong Earth Sanctuary is located in the picturesque Adelaide Hills on 34 hectares. The visit to Warrawong will begin with a guided "dusk walk" among Australia's unique animals. You will see animals and plants which you can not see anywhere else in the world. Rare Australian native animals thrive at Warrawong due to the construction of a "feral proof" fence. You will be able to watch potoroos and bettongs (small kangaroos) foraging for food, have the chance of seeing a platypus, bilby or koala and the opportunity to get up close and pat kangaroos. Flash photography is allowed to capture memories of this highly unique Australian wildlife experience.

The tour is approximately 90 minutes, after which you will be able to relax and enjoy a three course "Australian" meal in the rustic Warrawong Restaurant with a huge stone fireplace and floor to ceiling windows overlooking a bird and animal garden. Each course will have three options. You will have the opportunity to drink South Australian wines and beers, juice, soft drink, tea & coffee in unlimited quantities for 3 hours.
