

## ITS Website

Visits to the *ITS* Web site at <a href="http://www.its.org">http://www.its.org</a> continue to increase, up 12% since 2000 to 95 unique visitors/day. This count excludes fairly heavy activity from internet-robots, which help to include the *ITS* Website in internet databases but they don't represent our intended audience. Visitors came from over 90 countries. 63% of the hits came from the US, with most of the rest from Japan, Germany, UK, Russia, France, Canada and Australia. The most popular pages: the Online Directory, the ICT2001 page(s), and the homepage itself.

# **Highlights**

After review by their editors the *ITS* Website was selected by the Institute for Scientific Information® for listing in *Current Web Contents* (2001.02.01), which ISI describes as "a premium collection of evaluated scholarly Web sites". These are the same people that publish "Current Contents" and I'm very pleased to have our site selected.

A "Jobs" forum has been added where people can announce positions available and sought. Several notices have been posted already, and we hope this will grow.

The "ZT Links" portion of <a href="http://ww.zts.com">http://ww.zts.com</a> was re-worked last year into a "Yahoo-style" searchable directory of TE related links. About 1200 users have gone directly from the *ITS* website to ZT Links and a similar number have gone from ZT Links to the *ITS*. Over 190 thermoelectric-related links are now listed, including 30 different cooling module manufacturers.

#### e-mail

Only about 16 messages were delivered through the ITS Board mailing list, <a href="itsboard-list@its.org">itsboard-list@its.org</a>, down from about 60 in a similar period last year and 85 the year before. Please let me know if you are having trouble getting, or sending to, this mailing list. The ITS Board WWW site allows board members to add or remove e-mail addresses (their own, or other people) from the Board list.

Uncounted (hundreds!) messages were delivered to <a href="mailto:ict2001@its.org">ict2001@its.org</a> and a few post-conference messages were delivered to <a href="mailto:ict2000@its.org">ict2000@its.org</a>. Other special-purpose <a href="mailto:\*@its.org">\*@its.org</a> addresses can be easily set up upon request. Really, it is very quick and easy.

For example, <a href="mailto:nomination@its.org">nomination@its.org</a> was set up to deliver web-submitted nominations for the ITS Board. A special submission form was set up on the web for this purpose. A total of 4 Nominations were automatically delivered to each of the three Nomination Committee members at the time of this report:

- Prof. Gang Chen, UCLA, California, USA
- Prof. Hubert Scherrer, EMN, France
- Marat V.Vedernikov
- Dr. Mikhail Fedorov, Ioffe Institute, Russia

While only 3 people actually submitted nominations in 2001, I feel the feature is important because it allows non-attendees to participate in the nomination process.

About 13 ZT-spam messages were delivered to <a href="mailto:zt-spam-list@zts.com">zt-spam-list@zts.com</a>, since the conference in Cardiif in August, 2000. 983 e-mail addresses are currently on the list, updated to include all ICT2000 attendees. These messages provide key information on ITS and ETS-sponsored events, the Goldsmid Award as well as other TE related news.
